## Swiss Journal of Sociology Guidelines for Special Issues

## Submission and evaluation process

- Persons interested in editing a special issue shall send a **short**, **written description** of their project (500 to 800 words) to socio.journal@sgs-sss.ch.
- Submission of special issue proposals are accepted on a rolling basis.
- All special issue proposals are subject to evaluation by the Editors-in-Chief, who will inform the Guest Editor(s) of the outcome within two months of submission.
- In case of open special issues, a Call for Papers will be posted on the website of the Journal and disseminated widely. It should include a description of the special issue's scientific interest and objective, and a potential list of topics for articles.
- Special issues normally contain at least 5 contributions, and maximum 8.
- The Call for Papers is edited by the Guest Editor(s) and approved by the Editors-in-Chief.
  Contributions go through a two-stage selection process (abstract and full manuscript). The
  abstract selection is organized by the Guest Editor(s) and discussed jointly with the Editors-inChief, who have the final say.
- The manuscripts submitted within the framework of a special issue are evaluated according to the same procedure as all other manuscripts submitted to the Journal. The Guest Editor(s) are in charge of the organization of the evaluation process of all the manuscripts submitted. They suggest to the Editors-in-Chief the reviewers for the external evaluations and propose a decision on the acceptance, revision or reject of each manuscript submitted. However, the final decision to accept or reject a manuscript rests with the Journal's Editors-in-Chief.
- The Guest Editor(s) write an introduction to the special issue. This text may assume various forms (simple editorial article or introductory article). The introduction is discussed with the Editors--in--Chief, who may ask for modifications.
- The Guest Editor(s) may also include a discussion article written by an external contributor which reflects on the articles and their contribution to ongoing debates.
- The Guest Editor(s) commit(s) themselve(s) to adhering to the schedule and the different deadlines agreed to for ensuring the timely publication of the special issue.
